



# Fundraising Ideas For Workplaces

## How to Get Started

- One of the simplest and most effective ways to fundraise is to talk about it with your coworkers. Tell people you know about CCF and the work that is happening in Cambodia. Tell them about how you got involved and the needs of the organization.

## Ideas for Events and Activities

CCF supports raise funds in all kinds of ways, from running ultra-marathons in Iceland through to having a simple bake sale. No matter the size or scope of the project, every little bit helps and is appreciated.

- Every penny counts. A donation jar in your

business allows patrons and co-workers to donate small amounts to CCF. It's a passive fundraising method that requires just a little work. If you work in an office, different departments can compete to see who can collect the most change.

- Organize a team or group hike, bike race, or a run – and collect pledges for each mile or hour completed.
- It's hard to turn down a nice cup of coffee or tea. Sell the beverages to co-workers, while letting them know that proceeds are going to a good cause. In addition to coffee and tea, breakfast foods might be popular.
- If you work in retail or the restaurant industry, promote a specific day when a percentage of sales will be donated.
- Sell raffle tickets and donating the proceeds. A prize that many people would be willing to try to win would be a day off or other workplace perks.
- Accept donations from coworkers in exchange for the privilege to come to work in casual clothing.

Some companies offer an employee matching gift program/workplace giving program for donations to nonprofits. Most companies ask only that you complete a short form and mail it to Cambodian Children's Fund. Ask your human resources department for their gift-matching procedures and benefits.
